Learn to skate sessions for children ages 3-5 as of Dec 31, 2026.

CanSkate

This learn to skate program incorporates fun with the basics of skating focusing on agility, control and balance. Skaters work through 6 stages of badges. For children ages 6 years old and up or if a skater has completed the PreCanSkate program.

1 Day per Week:

2 Days per Week: \$575.00 **3 Days per Week: \$1,015.00**

Advance CanSkate (By Invite Only): \$100.00

Begins January 4th, 2027, must be registered for a CanSkate session to register for this program. This fee does not include the mandatory team jacket purchase (\$40).

Adult Open Session: \$255.00

This program is open to adult skaters looking to work on their skating skills. This is not a learn to skate program. Some skating experience is necessary. A 15-minute group lesson is included in the fee (for those who are interested). Private instruction is available upon request. Drop in option: \$20 per session.

Additional Information Regarding Fees



Skate Canada Membership

Each registrant will pay a non-refundable Skate Canada Membership fees of \$65.70. This fee is not included in the Program fees above.

Your Skate Canada Membership includes:

1. An accident insurance benefit at a substantially lower cost to the members than that available in other sports.
2. Access to high quality programs that are recognized and often sought after internationally and by other national sport organizations.
3. Access to qualified, NCCP certified Skate Canada professional coaches who have been trained through high quality training programs developed by Skate Canada.
4. National registry of figure skating qualifications (tests) and results (for qualifying events) held in a central computerized system for easy access.
5. Test certificates and Award of Merits for tests passed.
6. Website
7. Online store with special pricing for members on materials and Skate Canada merchandise.
8. Members only access to information including event announcements, rule book, information on athlete development, talent ID and off-ice training.
9. Toll free telephone and fax access to member services and national office.
10. Have the opportunity to participate in inter-club and invitational competitions.
11. Elite athlete and skater development funding and programs.
12. Opportunities for skaters to compete for positions on the national teams.
13. Voting privileges and opportunity to participate in the decision-making and direction of the Association.

Skate Ontario Lottery Fundraiser Booklet

Each registrant will pay a non-refundable fee of \$40 for the Skate Ontario Lottery Fundraiser Booklet (one time purchase). This fee is not included in the Program fees above.

The club receives \$22.00 from every booklet sold. Each booklet costs \$40.00. Please sell each ticket for \$2.00. If you sell your booklet, you KEEP the money. If you do not sell your tickets, please put your name on the stubs and return them to the OFSC by the beginning of December. If you are able to sell more booklets, please let us know, we would be happy to give you more booklets to sell.

Cancellation Policy

- *Withdrawal from a skating session before the first day of skating:* Skaters who wish to withdraw from skating for any non-medical or non-injury related reason may receive a refund provided they withdraw before the start of the first skating session. These cases will be charged a **\$75.00** administrative fee.
- *Withdrawal from a skating session once a skating session has started:* Skaters who wish to withdraw from skating for any non-medical or non-injury related reason may receive a refund. These cases will be charged a **\$75.00** administrative fee
- PreCan, CanSkate and all other non-StarSkate programs: NO refunds will be processed after the 2nd scheduled class of the session without a medical certificate.

Equipment Information

All skaters in all programs are required to provide their own hockey or figure skates (lace-up recommended) and a CSA approved hockey helmet. NO bike or ski helmets will be permitted. Skaters also need to provide their own warm clothing and gloves/mittens while they are on the ice. Helmets must be in good condition, not broken or missing pieces, and must fit the skater properly.
