

Enhancement Team Policy

The STAR Enhancement Team is by invitation only and runs for two sessions (Fall/Winter and Spring) throughout the skating year. The invitation is for the entire skating season; if the skater was invited at the beginning of the skating season, there is no invitation required to participate in the Spring Session.

This enhancement program provides skaters with the opportunity to develop their skating skills through extra training time and dedicated coaching to help guide them into a field of competitive skating.

Skaters that have been invited into the program by the head coach must show dedication and commitment to developing their skating. Skaters participating in this program must be punctual (On and Off-ice), have regular attendance, and provide notice to the head coach if they are going to be absent from a session. This will allow for proper scheduling of coaches.

If a skater is absent for more than 2 classes (on/off ice), without good cause and/or without prior notification to the head coach, they can/may be asked to leave the program. *No refunds will be provided in this case.*

Mandatory Program Requirements:

- Must have a full-time membership at OFSC; skate a minimum of 3 days per week on club ice
- Out of town skaters MUST show proof that they are registered full time in their home club
- Mandatory participation in Fundraising set up to benefit the STAR enhancement team.
- Mandatory participation in Off-ice conditioning; location will be determined at the beginning of the Fall/Winter session
- Skaters are required to compete in a Minimum of 2 competitions in the Fall/Winter session. These two competitions must be STAR 1-4, Provincial Series or Sectional Series competitions and NOT Fun competitions.
- Skaters must display a keen interest in pursuing competitive figure skating



Enhancement Levels and Criteria

- Skaters on the STAR enhancement team will participate in a specific training day per week which includes both On and Off-ice instruction. All skaters will be provided ice time on Saturday mornings throughout the winter season and Friday evenings in the spring session (subject to change if needed based on ice contracts with the City of Orillia).
- If numbers warrant, skaters will be divided into two groups which will be Skaters
 on the STAR enhancement team will participate in a specific training day
 determined at the time of registration. Skaters will be divided into two groups
 according to the level at which they are competing for the upcoming season. The
 head coach must be notified if a skater changes competition levels. If numbers
 warrant, skaters will be notified prior to the first skating day as to which group
 they will be participating in.
- Skating instruction will be in a group lesson format working on skating skills, jumps, spins, and other exercises to enhance skating development. Some individual lessons may be provided if needed. The Off-ice classes will follow the On-ice session.

Out of Town Skaters

- Skaters must abide by all mandatory requirements as stated above
- Out of town skaters that have been invited to the OFSC STAR Enhancement Team must skate a full membership at their home club and provide proof of membership in this club.

STAR Enhancement Fees, Policies & Refund Info

Fees:

- STAR Enhancement fees are based on the length of the session and how many weeks the session runs (the number of sessions on and off ice).
- Skaters are charged additional fees for the semi-private lessons they receive
 however; this fee will be split by the number of skaters that are in the
 group. These fees are billed separately by EACH coach providing



instruction.

- Skate Ontario Lottery Tickets: Star Enhancement Skaters will receive a second booklet of tickets to sell as part of the mandatory program's fundraising efforts and this is included in the registration fee. This booklet is in addition to the one that is included in the StarSkate program. There are twenty (20) tickets in each booklet for a total of \$40.00. Sell each ticket at \$2.00 each and you keep the money. All ticket stubs will be due back before the December break.
- Additional fundraising initiatives will be brought forward and presented to the team as required

Payments:

- Fall/Winter session: monthly installments September to February
- Spring session: ½ prior to the first session and ½ by April 15th.
